**About** 

Welcome to the 2024 AFEDEV Doctoral Days in Development! This workshop aims to provide an opportunity for early stage PhD students in development economics to showcase and discuss their work with fellow PhD students and faculty from other institutions. This year's edition follows on last year's workshop, held in Orléans.

### **AFEDEV**

AFEDEV is an organization founded with the aim of uniting researchers in the field of development economics through a collaborative initiative. The inception of this project, focused on establishing an academic association, commenced in September 2021. Subsequently, a Constituent General Assembly convened in January 2022, officially forming an interim steering committee.

Each year, AFEDEV organizes one international conference, and two PhD workshops, and also hosts sessions in the annual conference of the French Association of Economic Science (AFSE).

### **RITM**

The RITM is the Research Center in Economics & Management of the Université Paris-Saclay. It was created in 2013, and brings together about 70 Faculty and PhD Students in Economics or Management, who are affiliated with three components of the University (Faculty Jean Monnet, IUT of Sceaux, Faculty of Sciences).

The research conducted at RITM is multidisciplinary, and spans topics transversal to the Economics and Management fields, in particular Networks & Digital technologies, Innovation, Territorial issues, Globalization & Trade, but also Urban, Transportation, Gender, Health, Artificial Intelligence, Environment and Sustainable Development issues.

**Lunches** will be offered in the **Edith Penrose** room, located on the first floor of building E, just a few steps away from where presentations are held.



### How to get to our Campus (Faculté Jean Monnet)?


Arriving from Paris, the easiest way of reaching the campus is to take the RER B and to get off at the end station **Robinson**. Beware, the southbound trains of the RER B run on different branches with different end stations, so make sure you get on a train bound for Robinson.

Six buses also stop at Robinson: buses 128, 179, 192, 194, 294, 395 and 595. Buses 128 and 194 serve Paris (Porte d'Orléans). These are generally a less efficient way of travelling from Paris to Sceaux.
